THE ADVENT WREATH

The Advent Wreath and the lighting of the candles symbolize the expectation and hope of our Lord's coming into the world at Christmas, as well as the anticipation of his second coming at the end of time. (USCCB)

The Wreath is traditionally round representing God's complete and endless love for us.

The Candles represent the four weeks of the Advent season.

First Sunday of Advent - The Purple "Prophesy Candle" represents **HOPE**. We remember the Old Testament prophets who foretold of Jesus' coming.

Second Sunday of Advent - The Purple "Bethlehem Candle" represents **LOVE**. We remember the journey Joseph and Mary took from Nazareth to Bethlehem.

Third Sunday of Advent - The Rose "Shepherd's Candle" represents **JOY**. *Gaudete Sunday*. We reflect on the joy of the birth of Jesus.

Fourth Sunday of Advent - The Purple "Angel's Candle" represents **PEACE**. We reflect on the message of the angels "Peace on Earth, Good Will Towards Men."

HOW TO PRAY THE CHAPLET OF DIVINE MERCY



Optional Opening Prayers:

You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls,

and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world.

O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us.

(*Repeat 3 times*) O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fountain of Mercy for us, I trust in You!

Our Father, Hail Mary and the Apostle's Creed

For each of the five decades (*On each "Our Father" bead of the rosary, pray*)

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

(On each of the 10 "Hail Mary" beads, pray) For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Concluding prayer (*Repeat 3 times*)

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Optional Closing Prayer

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself.



Monthly Catholic Devotions of the Church Year

Each month of the year is dedicated to a particular devotion within the Catholic faith; the dedication of each month is based on historical events or a particular aspect of the liturgical calendar, or a combination of the two. These monthly Catholic devotions do not line up exactly with the time frame of the liturgical calendar, since they are fixed to standard calendar months rather than the Church seasons.

Some countries and areas have developed monthly dedications to devotions more specific to their area, but the following are the common, widespread Catholic devotions for each month throughout the year.

- January is the month of the Holy Name of Jesus.
- February is the month dedicated to the Passion of Our Lord.
- March is the month of devotion to St. Joseph.
- April is the month dedicated to devotion to the Holy Eucharist.
- May is the month of Mary; devotion to the Blessed Mother.
- June is the month of the Sacred Heart.
- ***** July is the month dedicated to the Precious Blood of Our Lord.
- August is the month dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.
- ***** September is the month dedicated to Our Lady of Sorrows.
- October is the month dedicated to Most Holy Rosary.
- November is the month dedicated to the Holy Souls.
- December is the month dedicated to The Divine Infancy of Jesus.
