From the Pastor March 28, 2021 Palm Sunday

Betrayal

At the Last Supper in the upper room, our blessed Lord tells his Apostle, Judas Iscariot, "What thou dost, do quickly." The other Apostles believe that Jesus is instructing him to go out to purchase what is needed for the Passover meal, but Jesus already knows Judas' heart. And sadly, Judas accordingly does the deed of darkness that he has plotted out of jealousy and self-centeredness. He "sells-out" his friend and Master to those who wish to destroy Him. Judas' kiss was a lie, for with it, he showed not love, but cold-hearted betrayal against Love Himself.

Although we will not betray our Lord for 30 pieces of silver or hand Him over with a false kiss, as Disciples of Christ we must always be aware of the poisonous sin of **calumny**. As Judas was directly unfaithful to the Lord and, we too bear false witness when we engage in any kind of **gossip**. As Christians we must be cautious to not fall into this *seemingly innocuous* behavior which is in fact an act of betrayal and is very destructive. As our dear Lord teaches us in the Gospel..." *It is not what enters one's mouth that defiles; but what comes out of the mouth is what defiles one*." (Matthew 15:11)

We should be aware that we can destroy others with our ungoverned tongues or merely by lending an ear to malicious talk. There is a saying that goes "listening to gossip…is gossip". How true! If there are no listeners, there would never be any gossip. The harm of gossip does not only exist in the "betrayal" of others, but the harm also lies in what we do to ourselves when we engage in it. Whether we practice gossip through speech or as passive listeners, there is no way we can continue to grow spiritually when we engage in this behavior. Spiritual growth can only take place within us in an environment completely free of any ill will.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church at **#2479** teaches us about 'Offenses Against Truth.' Detraction and calumny destroy the *reputation and honor of one's neighbor*. Honor is the social witness given to human dignity, and everyone enjoys a natural right to the honor of his name and reputation and to respect. Thus, detraction and calumny offend against the virtues of justice and charity.

Some of us may pride ourselves in refraining from gossip, yet as weak human beings, we may still (unknowingly) have big a problem with it. It's possible that though we keep our tongues silent, we might still keep our ears open for any "juicy talk" that can fall our way. We might also try to "shake the tree" if we believe another person has some "chatter" or "dirt" to share with us. This is almost always done in an apparently innocent manner (recall the "kiss" of Judas), often by simply mentioning the name of someone about whom those with whom we are conversing may have strong opinions.

As we begin Holy Week, let us keep in mind, amongst many memories of our dear Lord's Passion, that act of betrayal, hidden in the guise of a kiss. Gossip is a betrayal in a sense, as it rescinds the active commandment given to us by almighty God: To live out our lives as His true disciples, we must "love God with all our heart, with all our mind, and with all our soul…and our neighbor as ourselves." Let us be aware of any tendency we have toward gossip and remind ourselves that gossip is the enemy of the love and faithfulness that we should

Please make use of this Holy Week to grow in holiness. We should make every effort to attend the Liturgies of Holy Week. All of us (myself included) should make our confessions during Holy Week so that we may celebrate Easter with soul and heart renewed. Please see the schedule for the times for confession. Remember Confessions will be heard on Monday the 29th from 4.00PM until 5.30PM and then from 7.00PM until 8.00PM.

Holy Thursday: On Holy Thursday there will be no morning Mass. However, there will be **Morning Prayer at 9.00AM in the Church.** The **Mass of the Lord's Supper** is celebrated at 7.00 in the evening. On Holy Thursday we celebrate the Institution of the Blessed Eucharist, the Sacred Priesthood, and Our Lord's command of Charity. At the Mass the priest usually will wash the feet of twelve parishioners in memory of Our Lord's washing the feet of the twelve apostles. This is called the *mandatum*, which means commandment. *I give you a new commandment, that you love one another*. However, in this year of Covid the mandatum (which is always optional) will not take place. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will continue until 10.00PM in the Church.

Good Friday: On Good Friday there will be **Morning Prayer at 9.00AM in the Church.** The Solemn Liturgy of the Passion and Death of Our Lord with the Veneration of the Cross and Holy Communion will be at **3.00PM.** The Passion will be sung on Good Friday. Allow the singing of the Passion to wash over you and lead you ever closer to Our Lord. There will be the Stations of the Cross at 7.00PM.

Holy Saturday: On Holy Saturday there will be **Morning Prayer in the Church at 9.00AM.** After morning prayer there will be the traditional blessing of the food that will be eaten at Easter at **9.30AM.** The Great and Holy Vigil of Easter will be celebrated at 7.00pm on Saturday evening.

Fast and Abstinence Church Regulations

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen years and older on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat.

Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal on a given fast day. Catholics who are eighteen years of age but not yet fifty-nine are obligated to fast on Ashe Wednesday and Good Friday. To: All Clergy and Laity of the Diocese of Rockville Centre From: Lisa Honkanen, M.D., Director of the Office of Human Life, Family & Bioethics Re: Moral Questions Regarding the New COVID-19 Vaccines (Update) Date: March 3rd, 2021



As doses of the new COVID-19 vaccines, under FDA emergency use authorization, have begun to be administered to people in our country, a number of questions have arisen regarding the morality of accepting the new vaccines based on the link to abortion in their development and production.

The United Sates Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has released a memorandum, entitled *Moral Considerations Regarding the New COVID-19 Vaccines*. This document was authored by Bishop Kevin C. Rhoades, Chairman, Committee on Doctrine, and Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann, Chairman, Committee on Pro-Life Activities. A copy is attached to this memo, and the original may be found at <u>www.usccb.org/</u> <u>moralconsiderations-covid-vaccines</u>.

In addition, the National Catholic Bioethics Center has released its own memorandum, entitled *Points to Consider on the Use of COVID-19 Vaccines*. A copy of this memo is also attached, and the original may be found at <u>www.ncbcenter.org</u>.

This memorandum is meant to give a very simple and general explanation of the morality of using the new COVID-19 vaccines regarding their remote connection to abortion. This memo does not address the personal decision of an individual as to whether to be vaccinated or not. For a more comprehensive Catholic moral analysis of the use of the new vaccines, we encourage you to read both memoranda from the USCCB and the NCBC, as well as going to the website of the Office of Human Life, Family and Bioethics of the Diocese of Rockville Centre for more information which will be updated periodically: <u>www.drvclife.org</u> or <u>www.vaccinebioethics.com</u>

Ideally, a vaccine will have no connection at any stage of development or production with the use of cell lines initially derived from an aborted fetus. Unfortunately, none of the four COVID-19 vaccines either already or soon-to-be available to the public meets this criterion. The Pfizer and Moderna vaccines, using mRNA technology, do NOT use morally compromised cell lines in the design, development, or production of the vaccine. A confirmatory test, however, employing a cell line connected to abortion was performed on both these vaccines. Thus, while neither vaccine is completely free from any connection to abortion, in this case the connection to the initial evil of abortion is very remote and ended. In contrast, the Johnson & Johnson and AstraZene-ca vaccines, using viral vector technology, are more morally compromised because they rely on cell lines produced from a past abortion in the design, development and production stages of that vaccine as well as in a confirmatory test. Therefore, their connection to abortion, albeit remote, is both greater and on-going.

Consequently, on moral grounds related to their connection to the evil of abortion, it is recommended that, of the alternatives available now or in the very near future, **the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines are preferred to the Johnson & Johnson and AstraZeneca vaccines.**

Both the USCCB memo and the NCBC memo concur that, *for grave reasons, it can be morally permissible for Catholics to receive a vaccine remotely connected to the evil of abortion if there are no reasonable alter-natives available and they make known their objection to the use of morally compromised cell lines*. Indeed, vaccination under these circumstances may be viewed as an act of self-love and charity towards one's neighbor in limiting a serious infectious disease. However, it should be noted that there is no moral obligation to vaccinate.
