Dear Parishioners:

As we prepare the bulletin for this Sunday, we have all just learned of the eruption of war once again in the Middle East. Sadly, even the Holy City Jerusalem has come under missile attack. We must heed the words of the psalms, written by King David:

For the peace of Jerusalem, pray.

If I should forget you Jerusalem, may my right-hand wither.

Jerusalem, the great King's City, to it the tribes go up.

Jerusalem, Jerusalem, may all who love her prosper!

The City of Jerusalem was the place where the great events of the Redemption played out...Our Lord's Passion, Death, and Resurrection. It was from Jerusalem that Our Lord ascended into Heaven. Many of our parishioners have made pilgrimages to the Holy Land and have prayed at the Holy Places.
